

NABSSAR Babydoll Sheep Scale of Points		
General Appearance	Clean wool with ample coverage, polled. From the side, overall body length slightly longer than tall with the combined total of the length of loin and length of hind saddle being slightly longer than the shoulder to last rib. The back somewhat longer than the sheep is tall. Deep chest and body. From the top, shoulders well-muscled, flowing smoothly into the ribs with a width less than the hips. Body becoming wider from front to back. From the back, loins long, wide and thick. Legs well-muscled and large. Move with freedom of gait. Rams more masculine looking than ewes. Ewes with a broad, well attached but not pendulous udder with two teats.	10
Head	Wide, level between the ears, with no sign horns or dark poll. Ears set level with the head - neither drooping nor so upright to be perpendicular to the ground. Covered with some degree of fleece.	8
Face/muzzle/nose & lip leather	Full, not too long from the eyes to nose. Short fleece/hair should ideally cover the entire muzzle and extend from the corners of the mouth to a rounded point between the eyes on the adult sheep. The fleece on the cheeks, forehead and around the eyes should not be so long as to obstruct vision. Color of the fleece/hair on the muzzle of an off-white fleeced sheep should be a shade from very light tan to brown to cinnamon to mousy gray with even colors preferred. Blends of similar shades are acceptable in the fleece/hair of the muzzle. The muzzle of a black/gray sheep should be black. There may be some graying on the nose of black sheep with age. In the off-white sheep, the nose/lip leather should be black, dark to light gray or bluish gray. Speckles are common and are acceptable but solid colors are preferred. Please note lambs ^{often} are born with pink noses and coloring will come with time. In the black sheep, the nose/lip leather should be solid black, no other color is accepted. A bright solid pink nose/lips, or those without any pigmentation (pale white), are breed disqualifications and the sheep cannot be registered.	4
Eyes	Large, bright, and prominent. Predominately a shade of yellow to brown in color.	2
Ears	Of medium size, set level with the head – neither drooping nor so upright as to be perpendicular to the ground. Covered with some degree of fleece.	2
Neck	Wide at the base, strong and well set on to the shoulders.	5
Shoulders	Well set laid into the ribs, the top level with the back.	7
Chest	Wide and deep	5
Back	Level from shoulder to tail with only a slight slope of the croup, with a wide flat loin. Overall body length slightly longer than tall.	8
Ribs	Deep and wide, thick through the heart girth, with fore and hind flanks fully developed	7
Rump	Wide, and long, and well turned, only a slight slope of the croup.	4
Tail	Large and set on almost level with the chin when standing in a natural alert stance.	3
Legs	(Including thighs) which should be full, well let down, with a deep wide muscling through the twist and legs	8
Wool	Of fine texture, great density, and of sufficient length of staple of 2-1/2 to 4 inches or longer, cover the whole of the body down to the hocks and knees, and right up to the cheeks, with a full foretop, but not round the eyes, or across the bridge of the nose. Wool of 3/8 blood or 56 to 60-skein spin count or 24-28 microns in diameter is preferred. Solid color. No more than one blemish/birthmark (somatic mutation) 4-inches, or less, on any area of the animal. If the fleece/hair on the muzzle or the legs is bright white; but, one or the other has some tan in it, it is a breed discrimination. In the off-white sheep, if BOTH the muzzle fleece/hair and the legs' fleece/hair are bright white, it is a breed disqualification. No spotted/spot carriers.	15
Skin	Of a delicate gray to bright pink on off-white sheep and of dark tones on black sheep.	5
Carriage	Corky, legs short, straight, and come out of each corner of the body squarely and end in strong pasterns for fleetness and agility. Below the knee should be slight and slender from absence of muscles. Ewes should have a broad and wide stance in the rear. Close-set legs can rub against the udder and teats when full of milk.	7

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extremely broad heads Loosely attached or nubby scurs Slick ears Entropion (inverted eye lids) Wool blindness Woolly tear ducts Slight under or overbite, with teeth just barely touching the edge of the dental pad Excessive wrinkles Excessively wide, flat-topped shoulders Extra teats A blemish/birthmark (somatic mutation) in the fleece Black faced sheep with very light gray fleece Sheep heights 17-18" or 24-26" if sheep was born prior to 2025 		<p>The following are reasons why judges should not at Breeding Stock Shows award a prize to otherwise good sheep:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Evidence of cross breeding Solid 1" or larger scurs or horns Any eye color other than predominately a shade of yellow to brown Roman nose Bright solid pink nose/lip leather, or those without any pigmentation (pale white) Severe under or overbite, with distinct space between teeth and edge of dental pad Solid white hooves Adult sheep shorter than 18" or taller than 24" if sheep was born in 2025, or after Adult sheep shorter than 17" or taller than 26" if sheep was born prior to 2025 One or both testicles not descended Off-white fleeced sheep with a black muzzle and/or legs Off-white sheep, if BOTH the muzzle fleece/hair and the legs' fleece/hair are bright white Black-fleeced sheep with an off-white muzzle and/or legs Bright white-fleeced sheep More than one blemish/birthmark (somatic mutation) 4-inches, or less, on any area of the animal Spotted/spot carrier sheep Dirty or soiled wool or excess of VM (vegetable matter)
